## **5514 STUDENT USE OF VEHICLES ON SCHOOL GROUNDS**

The Board of Education regards the operation by students of any vehicle for transportation to and from school as a matter subject to Board authority because student safety is of paramount concern to the Board.

The Board will permit the use of motor vehicles by licensed students in accordance with district rules provided that such students present written parental approval, have been granted permission by the Building Principal to operate a motor vehicle on school grounds, possess a New Jersey driver's license, and have successfully completed a course in driver education.

The Board will permit the use of bicycles, Scooters, and skateboards by students in grades three and above in accordance with district rules provided such students present written parental approval, have been granted permission by the Building Principal.

Any student who rides a bike to school must park the bike in the rack provided. . The school encourages students to lock their bike at school. Scooters and skateboards should be brought into the schools. Bike helmets are to be worn by all under the age of 16 when in school grounds.

The Superintendent shall develop and disseminate regulations for the operation and parking of vehicles on school grounds. Permission to operate a vehicle on school grounds may be revoked for a student's failure to observe rules.

The Board will not be responsible for any vehicle that is lost, stolen, or damaged.

### Bicycles

The Board regards the riding of bicycles to school by students an assumption of responsibility on the part of students and their parents - a responsibility in the care of property, in the observation of safety rules, and in the display of courtesy and consideration toward others.

Students in grade three and above have the privilege of riding bicycles to school, but are not encouraged to do so because of traffic hazards.

Students who do ride bicycles to school are required to comply with New Jersey State Bicycle rules and regulations.

Students may use school bicycle racks at their own risk. The Board is not responsible for bicycles which are lost, stolen or damaged.
